

Since last month, I have gotten my new Can Am Spyder RT Limited Sea to Sky. I love it! It steers much easier and quicker than the 2013 I previously had. I took my first ride by going to the Montana Rendezvous in 3 Forks, MT. It was about 459 miles one way to the ride in. Mike and I had a great time and are looking forward to the Idaho Gem State Ride In on July 17 in Challis Hot Springs, ID and the Montana District Rally July 22-25 in Lewistown, MT.

I have to say I am a little nervous for our ride to Wing Ding later this week. We will be riding the backroads 9 to 10 hard hours a day plus stops so anywhere from 12 to 15 hours a day for 3 days! This will be my longest ride on a motorcycle to date! I have ridden 10-15 hours in one day but not for 3 days in a row. Once there, we will be enjoying all that Wing Ding has to offer. We will be taking a trike class to review our riding skills, as well as participating in seminars and round tables/forums. This will also be our first adventure with our new Bunkhouse Camping tent trailer. Mike has never tent camped so this will be a new adventure for him. Once we get worn out from all the fun, we will have the long ride back! We plan to take the interstate which will be a 22.5-hour ride instead of about 29 hours, so it shouldn't be quite as long as the ride there. But then again, coming home is always tough as you tend to be tired from your trip and just looking forward to getting home. I should have lots of stories to tell when I return.

Idaho District Ride Coordinator July 2021 Newsletter

Hello July! Hot weather and riding season are here, and with them the many things we need to watch out for. A member of Chapter E recently found out the hard way. While at a stop, Tom Hammond had checked the traffic and was preparing to move when a young man struck him from behind. The youngster had no plan to stop, just check traffic and continue, unfortunately he didn't check well enough as Tom was in his path. Tom survived with some minor bumps and bruises; his bike didn't fare as well. The two lessons to take away from his experience, is first, wear your protective gear. All the Gear All the Time, they could save your life. Second, watch out for the other guy, even the one behind you. Everybody has been couped up for far too long, so their focus is on themselves and where they're going and what they're doing, not what the people or vehicles around them are doing. Please be safe, we kinda like you and want all of you to be around for just a little longer.

Another issue we face this time of year are heat related injuries. Sun burn, dehydration, heat exhaustion, and heat stroke can all ruin your riding plans. Don't take them for granted. Sun screen and covers such as neck gaiters or arm sleeves are great options. Then there's dehydration. Rehydrate, rehydrate, rehydrate! Drink water and fluids containing

electrolytes. Avoid drinks with caffeine such as soda, coffee, and energy drinks. They can contribute to dehydration. Take breaks more often when you're out in the heat. Going until you become confused or disoriented puts not only yourself, but others at risk. Keep an eye on each other. If these conditions worsen, they can become deadly. Our rides should enjoyable, not the end of us. Be safe and stay healthy.

We have a couple events coming up in July. The 16th through the 18th is the 2021 Gem State Ride to Challis Hot Springs Campground. The 17th is the official day, but Leslie and I will be there on the 16th as we have several members arriving early and several folks from out of state joining us. Saturday evening, we plan cooking some hotdogs and toasting marshmallows around the fire pit, not to mention swapping some stories. Let the ride there be the adventure and the time there be for enjoying new people and tales of the road.

Only a few days after is the Montana District Rally in Lewistown, Montana. This begins the 22nd and ends on the 15th of July. Although there's still time to register, there's little room at the Inn remaining, so check availability. If you're already registered, we look forward to seeing you there.



While you're out enjoying what we do, don't forget to hydrate. Water is good, drinks containing electrolytes are better as you need to replace those in your system. Avoid drinks with large amounts of caffeine, as they can lead to dehydration. Heat exhaustion and heat stroke can also be ride and life ending events. Take care and look out for yourself and others for signs that indicate there may be a problem. Take more breaks during hot weather and prevent a bad outcome. Riding is supposed to be enjoyable, not deadly.

Which brings me to my last point, rider safety. Everybody, and I do mean everybody has been couped up for nearly a year with the pandemic. People are stressed, frustrated, and increasingly short tempered these days. As you get out and ride, remember they are doing the same thing, getting out and trying to shed some of the stress and frustration of the past year. As you ride, be courteous. The last thing you need is someone finally getting out venting their pent-up anger on you. In a fight between a car and your bike, the car will always win.

Also, people are trying to move faster to make the most of their time. Stop signs don't seem to mean as much when they're in a hurry. Tom Hammond witnessed this firsthand when a young man slowed and rolled through a stop, not realizing until it was too late, that Tom and his bike were in his path and ultimately struck Tom from behind. Tom's bike is a little worse for wear, but he survived to tell the tale. Watch out for the other guy, even that one behind you, and wear your protective gear. All of it may save your life.

Don't forget our meetings in July, Leo's Place on the 14th, beginning at 6pm and breakfast at The Black Bear Diner on the 24th, beginning at 8am.

As usual, ride safe and keep the shiny side up.






